#### **Course Content:**

#### Paper 1:

**Section B - Children's Language Development:** A discursive essay on children's language development, with a choice of two questions where the data provided will focus on spoken, written or multimodal language (30 marks)

## Paper 2:

### Section A - Diversity and Change

One question from a choice of two:

**Either:** an evaluative essay on language diversity (30 marks)

**Or:** an evaluative essay on language change (30 marks) **Coursework:** 20% of your awarded mark, comprising of a language investigation, creative writing piece and analysis of creative piece.
