

THE CURRICULUM

YOUR CHOICES

Woolwich Poly Sixth Form students follow a two-year programme of study, choosing from a broad range of 27 Alevel or Vocational qualifications. All the courses that we offer are graded as 'Level 3' qualifications by Ofqual, which means they are all of equal difficulty and accepted equally by the majority of universities, apprenticeships and employment opportunities.

Students have the choice of selecting a combination of three A-levels, which tend to be more heavily exam-based in their assessment, and/or vocational qualifications such as BTEC or Technical level qualifications, which have a greater proportion of coursework as part of their assessment. Some students may wish to deliberately select a greater number of 'facilitating subjects' as their choices; these are A-level courses that have been specifically recommended by some top universities and include English Literature, Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, History and Geography.

All of our subjects are delivered by our expert specialist teachers, over seven 50-minute periods a week. Our core aim is to support and secure aspirational levels of achievement for every student. We are dedicated to offering an environment that is conducive to the very best learning and attainment. Our goal is to prepare students for the next stage of their learning, be that university, apprenticeships, or employment.

Students are guided through their choices at their interview and will follow a personalised programme which best suits their ability and ambitions. Acceptance onto the chosen courses will be dependent on meeting the entry requirements. The standard entry requirements for our Sixth Form are a minimum of 5 GCSEs, grade 9 to 5, with at least a grade 5 in English and Maths. Please note that many A level subjects will require a grade 6 or above in English and/or Maths. Please check the individual subject requirements carefully.

If there are any extenuating circumstances consideration will be given on a case-by-case basis.

SAFE AMBASSADOR PROGRAMME

We have been working with The Safe School Ambassadors® Programme, originally delivered by Imago, which harnesses the power of students to prevent and stop bullying and mistreatment as well as nurture mental health.

The Safe Ambassadors received two full days of training with a trained professional. They looked at various factors that affect well-being and mental health and ways of helping their peers.

Our Ambassadors are always supported by a member of staff and are aware that they must share any important information that fellow pupils may share with them.


This programme creates a safe space for all students, particularly those in the lower years, who maybe struggling with home or school. We open a safe space, in the CLS, on a Tuesday's lunch which gives our students the opportunity to come along and talk to our Safe Ambassadors. Our Safe Ambassadors also take part in the lower school assembly to make themselves known to the lower school.

Our ambassadors work very hard to make sure that every student in the school knows they have a place they belong in our school community.

Students also have the opportunity to join the LGBTQ+ society and there are trusted members of staff that are trained to support students who identify as LGBTQ+. Counselling is also available through our designated 6th form counsellor.

TRANSITION: TAKING YOUR SIXTH FORM STEP



The academic leap from GCSEs to A-Levels can be challenging for students. In order to ensure a smooth transition from Year 11 into Year 12, we offer a number of opportunities to assist with this step.

All applicants will be interviewed for our oversubscribed Sixth Form. Appropriate courses and career aspirations are discussed during the interviews with experienced staff. During the summer term, all students who have been accepted into our Sixth Form will be expected to participate in our popular Springboard Transition School.

This is where we begin our Level 3 teaching over a one-week period towards the end of the summer term. All of this ensures that students make informed choices when selecting their Level 3 courses.

We also have an exciting induction programme at the start of the year which includes visits from both our partnership universities, Newcastle and Exeter, speakers from multiple professional backgrounds, and a team-building day to allow students to get to know each other as well as their form tutors.

Stepping up from Year 12 to Year 13 is also very important. We offer a whole week of "Beyond the Poly" activities, which is dedicated to further developing students' work, life and study skills, as well as preparing students for the UCAS application process.

PASTORAL CARE

DEVELOPING TOMORROW'S LEADERS

We have been recognised through Ofsted and other outside agencies as having an outstanding pastoral system. We believe that every student matters and that every conversation is important. High quality relationships and high-quality interactions with students are the hallmark of our work at the Poly.

Our highly experienced Sixth Form Heads of Year and tutor team take the students through their two years of Post 16 education, delivering a one-to-one mentoring programme to support academic studies, providing guidance for a successful future and enhancing the family ethos of our Sixth Form.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES: ABOVE AND BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

One of the many benefits of studying at the Poly is the huge network of community contacts and extra-curricular activities. We want our students to be leaders in the community. This means students need to be confident and as 'world aware' as possible. Our extra-curricular programme covers a myriad of activities, including sports, student ambassadors, as well as university visits and guest speakers from the academic and business worlds. We also offer enrichment trips every half term to broaden the experiences of our students.

2020 we added the Career Ready In programme to our offering at Woolwich Poly Sixth form. Career Ready is a complete 360degree opportunity in preparation for the world of work, including one-to-one skills masterclasses, mentoring, and experiences of work. Each individual career ready plan is mapped to specific learning outcomes, enabling our young people to develop the skills, confidence, and aspirations needed for future career success.

This year we have also begun working with The Safe School Ambassadors® Program (SSA) which harnesses the power of students to prevent and stop bullying and mistreatment as well as nurture mental health.

BEYOND THE POLY: PATHWAYS TO SUCCESS

Our aspiration for our students is to attend an outstanding university or secure an apprenticeship with a prestigious firm. This aspiration has led a number of our alumni into successful careers in multiple vocations, many of whom return to speak in assemblies of their journeys beyond the Poly. For the last five years, 30% of our students, on average, have attended a Russell Group university to study such courses as Medicine, Chemical Engineering, Mathematics and statistical Science, Theoretical Physics, Law and English Literature to name but a few. We have an extended school support system for admission tests and interviews for Oxbridge and other top universities. This also includes a free tuition package for the UCAT that takes place between the summer of Year 12 and Year 13, as well as the BMAT.



SCHOLARS PROGRAMME

Our purpose:

The core purpose of the Scholars Programme at KS5 is to nurture potential in our academically gifted students. We want to enable our chosen scholars to advance and embrace their talents in the company of teachers, students and invited guests, who share their passion and ambition. We also seek to fully prepare these students for pathways towards the most challenging and rewarding courses at the top universities and most sought-after apprenticeships.

Our aims:

- Support and nurture students with exceptional academic gifts
- Accelerate the pace of learning for our gifted students
- Foster extremely high expectations
- Promote independence in thinking and learning
- Add further breadth, depth, complexity and enrichment through our super curriculum
- Ensure that students are confident and fully prepared for early-entry university applications and interviews
- Our links and programmes:

Etonx: courses go beyond the curriculum – Etonx helps students gain the skills they need to achieve their goals. From critical thinking to LNAT preparation, this online platform is free to all students on the scholarship programme.

Cambridge Outreach: this link is used to facilitate personal statement support, early entry submissions and entrance exam preparation.

Wycombe Abbey Outreach: A world leader in girls' boarding education and a school that has outstanding results. This outreach link supports our prospective medical students and ensures that each student has one-to-one interview preparation and entrance exam support.



THE ACCESS PROJECT

Woolwich Polytechnic began working with The Access Project in 2018. The Access Project is a charity that combines tuition and in-school mentoring to support gifted students from disadvantaged backgrounds to achieve the highest possible grades and compete – successfully – for a place on some of the most competitive university courses in the country.

Students selected to join The Access Project's 4 year programme from year 10 onwards are paired with a volunteer tutor from a wide range of professions to receive free 1:1 subject tuition for an hour a week throughout the year. In addition, Access Project students benefit from a dedicated member of The Access Project team, who works at Woolwich Polytechnic School for Boys two days a week to offer expert advice on A-Level choices, university applications and academic development. Access Project students attend regular workshops arranged around their timetable and enjoy visits from speakers and outings to top universities. In addition, all Access Project students are given exclusive access to work experience and supercurricular opportunities, as well as a free subscription to Uplearn and AlTutor.Students not chosen to be part of the Access Project's programme can still benefit from support with applications, admissions tests and interviews through The Access Project's Medicine and Oxbridge societies.

Across all the 35 schools currently working with the Access Project, students on the programme are more than twice as likely to end up at a top university than those of similar ability who were not on the programme. In a 2022 survey of Access Project students, almost all participants felt that the initiative has helped them become more confident (97%), more independent (98%) and more positive about their future (95%).

For the students at Woolwich Polytechnic School for Boys, those enrolled in the Access Project typically apply to and receive offers from at least one top university and eight out of ten students will meet the grades needed to secure a place at one of these selective institutions.

BEYOND THE POLY: APPRENTICESHIPS

With the growing interest and increased numbers of opportunities in the apprenticeship ecosystem, we believe that this is alternative to university is becoming a more and more viable option for our young people.

We provide tailored career guidance with bespoke workshops and support for each individual student covering how to apply for jobs, interview skills and real-world financial literacy.

We support our young people with regular webinars and bulletin emails with new opportunities and firms recruiting for the roles that they are interested in.

Partnering with several different mentoring schemes has allowed our nonuniversity students to flourish and secure some of the best apprenticeships on offer. We have successfully helped secure roles for our young people on higher and degree apprenticeships at firms including KPMG, JP Morgan, Price Waterhouse Coopers, Barclays, OFCOM, Bloomberg, Kepler interactive & BCS. The roles that our young people have undertaken cover project management, IT and software development, business administration, engineering to name but a few.

As more and more firms see the benefits of hiring an apprentice, Poly is uniquely placed to support those looking for a path, outside of university, to secure the next step on the journey they take to their chosen career.









THE DRESS CODE: DRESS FOR SUCCESS

There is an old but true adage that says, 'You dress not for the job you have today, but for the job you want tomorrow.' Our dress code is smart business attire for all students. This reflects our aspirations for our students and the success that they have already achieved and for the standing our students have in our learning community. It is with tremendous pride that Woolwich Polytechnic Sixth Form, rated 'Outstanding' by Ofsted, celebrates the success of the Class of 2023.

47% of our students received A* - B grades, with a significant number continuing their academic pathways at Russell Group universities, including Cambridge, Edinburgh, and Warwick amongst others.
