Method of assessment

A Level:

Component 1– Practical reinterpretation of a text (20% of A Level mark)

Component 2 - Externally assessed unit of two performances (40% of A Level mark)

Component 3 - Externally assessed 2 hour and 30 minute written paper (40% of A Level mark)

Key Skills

We focus on developing students as independent learners. The A Level provides an opportunity to study themes from the point of view of a director, designer, performer and critic. The qualification is designed to enable students to acquire a knowledge and understanding of the language of drama and theatre as well as to develop their performing and analytical skills.
